For the past four years Colorado AIM and our allies have confronted and resisted the racism that surrounds the holiday and celebration of Christopher Columbus and the invasion that began with his arrival. Many of us have dedicated our time and energy, even at the risk of our safety and our liberty, to convey the message that we are committed to constructing a new future for the next generations -- a future forged in respect and justice for all peoples.

In 1992, thousands of people stood shoulder to shoulder in Civic Center Park to put an end to the Columbus Day Parade in Denver, and we succeeded. It was a victory, not for us as individuals, but for the idea that history has many sides and many versions. Unfortunately, stopping racism often requires confronting the racists who perpetuate it, and such confrontations can often divide people -- even people of goodwill.

In 1993, AIM has decided to call our allies, of all races, faiths, and cultures, back together, to commemorate all of the people who have given their lives in the pursuit of justice in the hemisphere. We will also have a multicultural musical celebration of the United Nations International Year for Indigenous Peoples. Finally, we will have a ceremony to rededicate our lives to the next seven generations. We will plant seven aspen trees to remind us that all of our decisions - political, economic, social and cultural must be made with the next seven generations in mind.
